Eligibility

To be eligible, applicants must be:

Residents of the Shire of Yarra Ranges who are currently undertaking or are enrolled to commence:

- Tertiary studies in a recognised health science course at an Australian University or higher education TAFE institute or
- Vocational education and training (VET) in a health science field

Applicants must have resided in the Shire of Yarra Ranges for at least 12 months. Students temporarily residing outside of the Yarra Ranges Shire for study purposes are also eligible but must demonstrate that their full-time residence is in the Yarra Ranges. Undergraduate and postgraduate, part-time and full-time students can apply.

Selection criteria

The selection panel will consider the following criteria:

1. **Academic achievement** that demonstrates your commitment to succeeding in your chosen field of study
2. **Community involvement** that demonstrates your commitment to your local community
3. **Personal attributes** that could help demonstrate your suitability for the scholarship.

The panel will also consider special circumstances, including financial and/or personal hardship. Referee comments are also required in your application.

Selection panel

The selection panel includes representatives from the Inspiro Board of Governance and a community representative.
